I no longer debate that issue because I accept my responsibility in making man today and ask you to accept yours. It is our responsibility to speak life to man. It is our responsibility to be the window of heaven that pours out the blessing. # 1000 Men Rally: 4 Years Later

t seems like yesterday when God planted in Gregory L. James the vision of the 1000 Men Rally. But, it was not yesterday. It was almost 4 years ago. Since that time the Rally has gone from Walker-Ford Community Center, to the Court House Square of Gadsden County, to Downtown Tallahassee, Florida. Though the locations have changed, the mandate has remained the same; to empower men to take their position in their community, their families, their State, their nation. Some may debate whether there is any significant result from these efforts. Well according to Pastor Gregory James, the visionary; God says, "Yes I am pleased."

"As the 1000 Men Rally celebrates this 4th year in the making, we have to announce to you why the number 4 these same men are now being released from prison," says James. "Men have big shoes to fill; and even bigger when they are ex-offenders. As a Redeemed Ex-offender, nobody can imagine what it is like to be released from prison and then be denied access to basic human rights and opportunities; not unless you have lived it or you are living it. Yes...... I make it look easy, but it is not easy," says James.

You can see the passion of James' desire for the redemption of all men through his eyes, as tears begin to flow down a face that appears to have aged slightly during his 13 years of incarceration. With a pause to compose himself he continues, "it's not just the physical bars of prison and societal restrictions that have strong-



r Willie Myles is an entrepreneur, educator, author and social activist. His primary work is with the Black Community and Black Children. He has a profound interest in evoking meaningful social movements to ameliorate the devastating risk factors, placing Black Children and Black Families at risk.

In most of my writings, I discuss the deteriorating condition that the Black family is in, however I have yet to see collective efforts to remediate this condition. In all life domains Black children in Black families are in the most deteriorating state. African American babies in the U.S. today are two-and-a-half times more likely to die before their first birthday than white babies. Only three out of 100 Black kindergartners will graduate high school. Black families are 7 times as likely to be persistently poor. Eighty five percent of all children that exhibit behavioral disorders come from fatherless homes. As I began to evaluate the "why us" I have to revisit the issue of the impact of slavery on our condition. I submit to you that once the emancipation proclamation was signed it offered no "transition program or workshop" on what should happen next. As a matter of fact, some of the slaves decided to stay with their masters. Interestingly, slaves were not allowed to read. Today 75% of African American boys are in special education. They are 4 times more as likely to be expelled. Black men suffer far worse health than any other racial group in America. Blacks are twice as likely to be arrested.

The mass incarceration of Black males has a profound impact on the Black community and the stability of the Black family. Reports state that there are more Black men in prison and on probation than there were enslaved in 1850. What kind of impact does this have on the stability of the Black family? Black men are the foundation to family and serves as the protector and provider. If the protector and provider is locked away...then who protects and who provides? The government designated Uncle Sam

to this role of being the Protector (Housing) and provider (welfare). Most of my conversation has been in regards to Black families and how these families are faring in the midst of difficult times. What many of my colleagues and I agree upon is that we as adults are responsible for the condition that our family and children are in. We have not introduced a sense of history or perspective for them. They do not know who we are, and the rich heritage that gave us the strength to overcome slavery and obtain basic human rights in the 1960's. Some want us to treat slavery as some ancient event. One hundred and fifty years is not so ancient when the effects continue to somehow perpetuate itself in the Black community in 2011. We have failed to emphasize those values of working together, being self sufficient, and supporting the village. It is those values that have helped us to sustain in a nation like America, and obtain the right to be on the playing field, though sometime uneven.

It is critically important that we take immediate action to cure our condition for the next generation. We must first address their spiritual needs. They must know who God is in the midst of it all. Secondly we must take control of our children's education. We must not depend upon a system to instill family and cultural values and teach our history and heritage. We must take control of our economic direction. We must stop teaching our children to get a good education to work for someone else. We must teach them early to get an education to meet the economic and social goals for the community. We must start eating healthy, because a sick body affects the mind. We must rearrange our social and political priorities. We must not engage in any behavior that would prove detrimental to the well being of our family and our children. No more reports are needed; we simply need to act on what we know and become more accountable for our children, our family and preparation for the next generation. It must start today. That is how CRITICAL the condition of the Black family is. We can no longer delay treatment, less we die.

Bishop Victor L. Powell, Rhema Cathedral, Albany GA




"It is known that every man has a journey and even if he is handed a map, most maps do not show where the potholes are in the road. Thus, unexpectedly vou hit one or two and suddenly everything is out of alignment." Bishop Powell believes that is what has happened to man. On his way to destiny he hit a pothole and he just got out of alignment. Everyone knows that potholes are really not that deep, but they are dangerous. They cause problems with suspension, cause accidents, and usually present themselves as invisible until vou are just too close to prevent hitting them without swirving out of control.

Bishop Victor L. Powell says that we have to realign man back to his

"son" position. "Along the way he hit a pothole. Somehow on the road to destiny they became fathers and forgot that they were sons. We have to restore fathers back to sons," says Powell. "The church has to become the surrogate mother and father to all who are lost not just people in the church. The church has to be the surrogate mother and father to the young men who are joining gangs, and dropping out of school, the single mothers, the former offender who is reentering society. The church, which is me and other believers like me, is the key to the reconciliation and realignment of man." Bishop Powell joined the 1000 Men Rally in 2009, because it correlated with his God given mandate to connect men with Spiritual Fathers. As a Presiding Bishop who has a very poignant prison ministry, he has identified that Black men are imprisoned primarily because they lack the "father piece." He declares that, "this has nothing to do with the incompetency of the mother but the absence of the father." Bishop Powell has authored and published training manuals and is an international facilitator for leadership training, prison ministries, parenting and men ministries to name a few. Bishop Powell is known as the father of sons across this nation. He has formed male mentoring programs that match men who have hit the potholes with stable men who can help realigned them as sons. When asked what is the message every pastor should be giving men? Bishop Powell replied "God never changed His mind about man. You must understand your original identity. You are the image of God, no matter your past you have been created in the image of God."

The Redeemed Men of God stand with the Reformed Ex-Offenders and walk with them as they reenter society. It is our commitment to help ensure that more than cell doors open for them. We the Men of God, some who have carried this label "Ex-Offender" are developing not another program, but a *Movement*," Bloomer says.

Bishop George Bloomer reports that it seem like many years ago that he was locked away in New York's notorious Riker's Island Prison. "The prison became my processing chamber the place where the Lord would finally get His "Yes" out of me. Ultimately, all God wants is a yes. Despite the trials and tribulation of my life God placed inside me a fiber of sustainability that only He could have woven. He not only had a plan for my life, He had purpose for my life, even during the episodes of lawlessness and disobedience" Bloomer says.

Bloomer testifies that men who find themselves on the opposite side of the law, and are finally released from prison are released with an expectation from the system that they will be back. "How else can we explain the release granted access denied" concept that is systematically enforced throughout this country?"

When asked why a summons? Bloomer reported, "A summons is a notice sent out by the authority of a government entity. We are the authority in the Kingdom of God and we are serving notice to those making decisions which inhibit ex-offenders' successful re-entry by use of legal discrimination, disenfranchisement and social exclusion and that includes the church. Ex-Offenders' National Summons-ENS is driven by the needs of Ex-offenders and their families. We work to reduce crime first and foremost by overcoming the barriers of

social exclusion, discrimination, and disenfranchisement. These barriers prevent Reformed Ex-offenders from successfully reintegrating into society and thus inhibiting their ability to lead crime free lives. This is a non-partisan, non-political, non-denominational issue and movement. These are human rights issues that adversely affect who we are as a people, living in a free country", says Bloomer.

According to Bloomer, ENS will provide a pathway through the faith base community and serve as a voice for Ex-Offenders, their families and friends to be heard. "We will offer resolutions to the plight of people re-entering society with limited to no way to meet their basic needs or family needs after prison. Though we will address the whole man, ultimately it is about transforming Reformed Ex-Offenders to Redeemed Ex-offenders", says Bloomer.

Bishop Bloomer has committed to take the ENS movement across the nation in collaboration with cofounders Pastor Gregory L. James, Tallahassee, FL and Bishop Himrod Ambroise, Orange, NJ and other Presiding Prelates and Senior Pastors across the nation. As a Messenger of Deliverance, Hope, and Redemption, and his recent acceptance as the Host of the Word Network, he says he believes it is all in divine timing, "I am really excited about every platform God affords me for the purpose of winning souls for Him. We accept our assignment as Spiritual Wardens......





## **Navigating the Rough Seas of Re-entry**

"Instead of diving into uncertainty, we have to know that we can make it and allow others to help us navigate"

It's October 2008, just a few weeks after the 1000 Men Rally and Eldrick James has just been released to a work release program. Not knowing where he's going to work, he makes a call to his childhood friend, State Representative Alan Williams, who has recently been working collaboratively as a partner with the 1000 Men Rally an event that was the vision of another childhood friend. William decides to reach out to one of the corporate partners of the 1000 Men Rally 2008, Captain D's owner/operator Terry Gillis, in hopes that his partnership would extend past the events, but would help in the evolution of change.

Now it's August 2011, just a few weeks before the 1000 Men Rally and Eldrick James, the former ex-offender is now the store manager of the Tallahassee Captain D's. "I felt that since I was coming out of prison, I had to work harder than others because people were looking for me to mess up," James stated. After being hired as a cook, James worked his way up and went through doors he claims were opened for him. "I never gave up hope. I had to overcome odds

because I knew there were people out there looking for me to fail. The key to my successful re-entry was good family, friends, and faith. And to those in prison, stay focused and strong. There are opportunities out here. Keep God first. Keep looking up and looking ahead and everything will work out for you." James credits both Williams and Gillis for believing in him and giving him the opportunity to succeed.

Terry Gillis, believed in James and wanted to give him and men like him second chances. "I don't believe in giving too much, but I do believe in opening doors. It's up to you to take advantage of the opportunity in front of you." Gillis says. Gillis, who may not be familiar with prison himself, has had some hard times and that is why he believes in giving second chances. "When I was 19 years old I became a father. I had no idea how I was going to take care of this child and this woman." But Gillis remained determined and optimistic about things and at 22 years old with a child and wife, Gillis got into the restaurant business only making \$3.35 an hour. "I had to make it work. I wasn't about to do anything illegal to be separated from my wife and kid." Gillis is now the owner and operator of Captain D's in both Tallahassee and Quincy. Gillis says the message he sends to those who are still incarcerated, "stay positive and make good decisions. Because the decisions you make now will begin to effect how things will turn out for you."

Here it is now 4 years into the 1000 Men Rally and Terry Gillis continues to be an avid supporter of the rally, State Representative Alan Williams continues to serve as an annual chairperson and Eldrick James continues to be the evidence of a successful re-entry, and what happens when others reach out to help navigate the re-entry process.

**Inside-Out:** A Story of Return, Re-entry, Rejection and Redemption

Only in America and the State of Florida would a developed humanitarian society deny access to its citizenry. Republican Governor Rick Scott and the Florida cabinet have denied access to non-violent felons. They have chosen to end the automatic restoration of voting and other civil rights to nonviolent felons once their sentences are up. Acting as the sentencing judge, Governor Scott and his cabinet voted to change the clemency

board rules and warrant at least a five-year waiting period before the formerly incarcerated felon can even apply to get their rights back. The mere fact that Law Enforcement and State Prosecutors favored such a change is an indication that there is a lack of comprehension of the term "double jeopardy".

This camouflaged act of double jeopardy affects over 100,000 ex-felons. That means that there are 100,000 votes that will not be casted, at least 80,000 formerly incarcerated will be added to the unemployment roll, and the likelihood of recidivism is eminent. The republican lawmakers justify their action with the explanation, that people who have broken the law need time to prove themselves. How does deprivation of civil rights allow someone to prove themselves?

It would appear that if the State Government truly wants proof that an ex-felon is successfully assimilating back into society, they would require that they vote. They would require that employaccess to employment would be in place. They would require that fair housing and healthcare be extended to people coming out of prison. The probability of violating is reduced when the formerly incarcerated are given access to the basic civil rights given to all citizens. To deny access to people who have paid their dues and risk jeopardizing their re-entry success can not be interpreted as anything less than a form of double jeopof the ability to meet his basic needs legitimately he resorts by nature to illegitimate options. That's a fact. It is contradictory to invest Millions of dolincarcerated access to basic human rights and access to resources needed to meet basic human needs for themselves and their family in some instances. One would now have to question if this re-entry platform is just another economic plot which dignifies the release and continuously and strategically denies the access. Non-violent formerly incarcerated should not have been sentenced again by the State of Florida. It's unfair and bordering unconstitutional.

Proceeds from this book will benefit children whose parents are incarcerated.

# Inside-Out: Story of converting pain into purpose and prosperity

"Pain in the eyes of my children because I had not been there was a motivation for me."

How do you explain five years of not ever coming home, missing birthdays and the first day of school? How do you explain Father's Day at school and your friends ask "you gotta a daddy?" After all they have never seen him in the five years that you have gone from kindergarten to 4th grade. How do you explain it? Eric McKinnon, a local entrepreneur and former ex-offender says it was that pain in his children eyes that motivated him to not give up no matter what, after five years of incarceration.

McKinnon whose life has not been an easy one, admits that everything he has experienced was a result of choices. He admits the 5 years behind bars was because of choices, and the success he is experiencing now is because of choices. The 15 minute interview was as if McKinnon hit a rewind button, and then fast forward. He replayed a snippet of

prison life to us; but not what prison did to him rather what he did while in prison. "I prepared in prison. I read a lot. I had time to think about what was and what should have been....I learned to type 180 words per minute in prison. When I left prison, I left with my record in hand, but not in heart. I left with credentials and credibility," says McKinnon. "I knew my credentials would speak for me, but my hard work would speak louder. I had a mindset that if a door was shut and locked, then I would just knock on another one, until a door opened."

Thank God for a changed mind says McKinnon, because he had resolved that whatever it took to make it work on the outside, he was not going back on the inside. His resolve manifested a lion's strength that was camouflaged in quiet humility. He reunited with family, friends and faith, which became his anchor for holding on during the door closing experiences. He began to establish alliances with people who could help springboard him. "My current business partner recently joined with me for this 2nd location. Our experiences are similar but our values are even more similar, our value for family, faith, and financial accountability". McKinnon, who admits that his business success takes a lot of hard work, and he has to balance it with giving back to the community, taking care of his children as a single father, and mentoring other children and adults in the community, says "this is just the beginning. As I am faithful over little I will be provided even the more.....I am pleased to be a mentor of men who are seeking another chance at getting it right."

McKinnon constantly sends a message to people reentering society, "If the world don't accept us, we must build our own world of opportunities for legitimate businesses, support mechanisms and empowerment."




